- Francesca Peri (Zürich, Switzerland) The mechanisms how microglia identify and remove dysfunctional neurons from the brain
- Francesca Granucci (Milan, Italy) Dendritic cell maturation and their role in activating and controlling NK cell functions



The **Keynote speaker** this year was **Vlada Stamenkovic**, a former physics student at the ETH, who is currently working at the Jet Propulsion Laboratory (JPL) for NASA in California, USA. He is leading a research group that develops probes to examine the subterranean areas on Mars, which potentially harbor environments that are permissive of simple life forms. Due to an unforeseen

The insights in what his work for NASA comprises, the amount of thought that has to go into planning a mission and what they have learned from their projects so far, was highly fascinating.
